Institution has implemented various facilities to ensure the safety, health, and empowerment of women. Additionally, meritorious female students receive scholarships from IWSA (Indian Women Scientists' Association), and women staff are granted LWP maternity leave of up to six months.

1. Girl's Common Room with Attached Ladies Washroom

Facility Details:

- The college provides a dedicated Girl's Common Room (GCR) equipped with basic amenities, such as seating arrangements, for relaxation or academic discussions.
- The GCR includes an attached Ladies Washroom, ensuring privacy and comfort for female students.
- A vending machine for sanitary napkins is installed, allowing students to access essential hygiene products.

Purpose:

To create a safe, comfortable space for female students during breaks.

2. Sanitation and Health Facilities

Separate Washrooms for Women:

 Well-maintained and hygienic restrooms for women, strategically located for easy access.

Sanitary Napkin Vending Machines and Disposal Units:

- Sanitary napkin vending machines are available, ensuring convenience for female students.
- Sanitary disposal units are provided to ensure safe and eco-friendly waste management.

Health Awareness and Support:

 The college organizes health awareness programs, including seminars on menstrual hygiene and reproductive health. In case of emergencies, students are taken to NMMC healthcare centers for prompt medical assistance.

3. Counseling Services

· Facility Details:

 The college offers professional counseling services to female students, helping them navigate academic, personal, and psychological challenges.

Purpose:

 To provide a support system that assists female students in managing stress, personal issues, and academic pressures.

4. Safety and Security

CCTV Surveillance:

 Strategic placement of CCTV cameras across the campus ensures a secure environment for female students.

Security Personnel:

 Trained female security staff is stationed at key entrances and common areas to ensure continuous monitoring and assistance.

Anti-Ragging and Grievance Redressal Committees:

- An active Anti-Ragging Committee ensures compliance with Vishaka Guidelines and handles any complaints of harassment or bullying.
- A dedicated Grievance Redressal Committee for Women addresses concerns related to discrimination or academic stress.

Cyber Safety Awareness:

 Workshops are conducted to educate female students on cyberbullying and how to protect their data online.

Female Non-Teaching Staff:

 Female staff members are present on each floor for monitoring and providing assistance to students.
